WHEN FIRE AND WATER COME TOGETHER

California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (Cal Fire), North County Fire Protection District, and Rainbow Municipal Water District, three special districts created by the people of this community to provide specialized essential services, have teamed up again taking their commitment to our local community one step further.

By constructing the first ever Rapid Aerial Water Supply (RAWS) in San Diego County, we are quickly becoming the benchmark for other communities in San Diego County.

When temperatures rise, the air gets hot and dry, and Santa Ana winds start blowing, this is the team that puts Fire and Water together to protect and service our community.

Prior to reservoirs being covered, our local fire fighters were able to swoop down and gather water from these reservoirs to quickly respond to fires in the area. Then they had to rely on seasonal ponds for rapid response which was not adequate for these special districts. As a solution, this group of special districts teamed up to install a fire protection system on RMWDs Pala Mesa site, forming the RAWS partnership.

The RAWS allows the firefighting pilots to remotely operate a snorkel site (pictured above) where they can fill the 12' diameter by 5' deep tank in 120 seconds, fill up with their hoses, and return again and again to refill.

Having this type of local resource will reduce flight times between trips. A lot of fires start along the I-15 corridor, making this facility an ideal location above Pala Mesa.
