How It Works

The system uses an innovative Wi-Fi connected sensor that simply straps around the existing water meter and utilizes a companion app for homeowners to follow their water-use results.

The Flume Smart Water Monitor tracks your water use 24/7, alerting you to excessive water use and leaks.

This device normally sells for \$199.00 plus tax and shipping. The District and Flume Tech have partnered to offer customers the device for a \$49 annually maintenance fee.

District staff were first on the scene of a single vehicle accident into a telephone pole due to the excessive rainfall. The accident victim was quickly assessed for injuries and the road blocked off to prevent any further accidents.

Our wastewater crew was particularly busy due to the weather conditions with managing the wastewater system and were able to keep flows moving despite the rains.



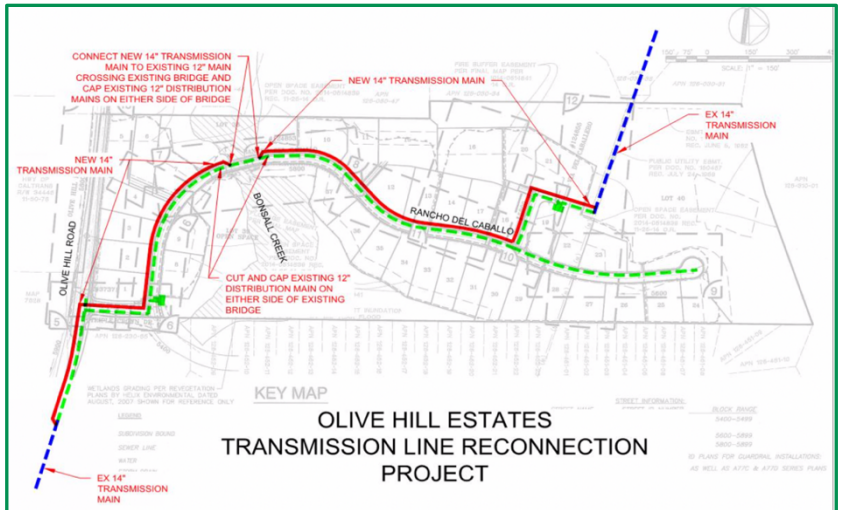
Transmission Line Project at Olive Hill Estates

In April, the Board of Directors awarded a construction contract for the Olive Hill Estates Transmission Line Reconnection Project. This project will increase the flow of water throughout our system and allow high pressure to feed areas in the southern part of the District and increase system looping.

This is not only an important enhancement for our continued distribution of water but also strategic in our efforts to detach from the Water Authority. Local residents will still be supplied water from a pressure-controlled main during the physical work. The Project is scheduled to begin mid-July and run through into 2021, about 200 calendar days.

After the work is completed the contractor will fill and pave over the trench, replace any payment markings and restore the area.
